# Why we exist

**Over 5 million people live in Uganda's slums.**

Life isn't easy here; over 30% of adults have never accessed education, there are very high rates of unemployment, household incomes are unstable, and many families survive on just one meal a day.

**There are so many barriers for children growing up here.**

Often, children end up in a cycle of poverty, as with no access to school or skills training and no access to social care means it's incredibly difficult to escape slum life, and these children end up left behind, not fulfilling their potential.





# Our Mission

**We help kids in Uganda survive and thrive.**

We provide for both their immediate needs and strengthening their futures through community outreach, protecting, educating and skilling programmes.

At Kids Club Kampala, we believe that every child is unique, special and deserves the opportunity to reach their full potential. Our work is based on a holistic approach, where we meet the immediate needs of children and families while empowering them to bring about long-term, sustainable changes in their lives through education and skills development.

This creates inspiring, motivated changemakers amongst our communities, who, after receiving support, often come back and inspire others, creating transformational change in our communities.





# Our Programmes

Our programmes are a lifeline to vulnerable children and we are currently supporting over 300,000 individuals across 12 communities in Uganda. Children and families living in Kampala's slums have complex needs which is why we take a holistic approach, providing for both their immediate needs and strengthening their futures through the programmes below.



## Community Outreach

working with community leaders to establish projects to aid communities, increase social cohesion, offer safe spaces for children to meet and play, and provide for immediate needs



## Protecting

safeguarding support to prevent and protect children in danger, aiding with social justice cases, responding to emergencies and child focused mediation for families



## Educating

provide free education through early years education to out of school children and free primary and secondary sponsorship to help families educate their kids



## Skilling

vocational training to young people and parents who have no means of making a sustainable income, providing business training, mentorship and skills so families can provide for their kids

Our vision is to see children's lives transformed, communities empowered and poverty reduced throughout Uganda.

We work in partnership with our passionate team in Uganda, who lead and implement projects that are a lifeline to some of the most vulnerable children in the world. We want every child, regardless of their background, to have the opportunity to reach their full potential.
